## Facebook and Privacy

Facebook, it's a great way to find friends and keep in touch. But do you want everyone finding you? Do you want your aunt to see the off color jokes from your old college buddy? Will potential employers like what they see when they look at those party pictures? So how do you share that personal info with your friends, family events with your family and public stuff with everyone else?

### Friends Lists

First off, take advantage of Friends Lists. Did you know you can group all your Facebook friends into categories? Then using Facebook security you can determine which lists can see what types of content on your Facebook page. Once you set up your lists, you can customize your security for each type Facebook information. Click Account -> Privacy Settings. It's under the section Sharing on Facebook then the heading Custom. Click Customize Settings. Each item you can Click Everyone, Friends of Friends, Friends Only or Customize. If you click Customize you will see the following. Type in the name of the groups you created.

### Directory Information Shared with the Public

Do you want EVERYONE to find you on Facebook? Who gets to see who are your friends? Check your Basic Directory Information. To access: Click Account -> Privacy Settings -> Basic Directory Information. Click the View Settings at the end of the paragraph of info. It's not underlined, just blue text. It's almost like they don't want you to find it. Hmmmm... After each type of Facebook item there is a button. It's a drop down. Click it to get a list of options.

### What your friends can share with you or about you

Something you may not know is that while you can control information about yourself, your friends can also share information about you. This Facebook control is called "What your friends can share about you." Make sure you review the checkboxes and uncheck anything you're not comfortable with. To access: Click Account -> Privacy Settings -> Applications and Websites Info accessible through your friends

Hey your friend just found a lonely calf in Farmville!!! Aren't you excited? Did your buddy just level up in Mafia Wars? Woo Hoo! Okay so maybe it's not that exciting. Your friends can't help it. Those games access their friend lists. Did you know you can hide specific Facebook app updates? Hover your mouse over the upper right hand corner of the post. An "X" will appear. Click on the "X." A menu will appear. You get three choices. Hide your friend (you probably don't want to do that), Hide the game or Cancel.

If for some reason you want to start playing that specific game you can unhide the posts: On the top of your feed select "Top News". Scroll to the absolute bottom of your feed and click "Edit Options." A menu will pop up showing you the hidden applications. Click the "Add To News Feed" to make them show up again.

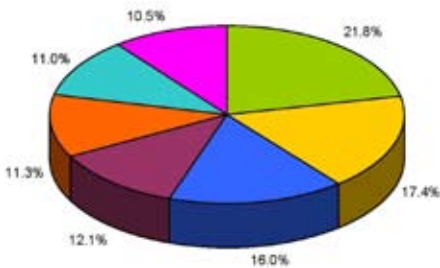
### Programs and Websites

Not everyone on Facebook wants to be found. The general public can search and view your profile unless you specify otherwise. Click Account -> Privacy Setting -> Applications and Public Search. Make sure it's not checked.

At the bottom of the Privacy page, you'll see Applications and Websites. Click Edit your settings. Review the applications that you have installed. You may find things you didn't know were installed. You can turn them off. Edit settings for each of the settings to your desired level of privacy.
